A DIFFERENT LOOK AT DISCIPLINE

Disciple – a follower learning from the teacher.

Instruction – information about what to do and how to do something.

Self-control – deliberate, intentional choice by someone to control his/her actions, words, emotions and thoughts.

Coach – to train or instruct someone in a specialised skill or sport.

Inspire – to fill someone with the desire to do something creative and unique to him or her.

Persevere – never give up when a task is challenging and stretches you almost beyond what you think you can achieve.

Learn – actively engage in acquiring knowledge and skills by studying and from life experiences in and outside the classroom.

Initiative – after you have been disciplined, instructed and inspired, you to take charge of your learning and use the knowledge and skills you have acquired to achieve your educational goals.

Nurture – encourage, develop or cultivate your skills, talents, abilities; and then look around and help, encourage and develop other people so that they achieve their educational and personal goals.

Educate yourself – explore all opportunities outside the classroom to learn more, to explore and increase your knowledge of what you learn in the classroom and develop your unique skills beyond the instruction of the classroom.

Discipline is more than rules and conducts and detention; it is a tool, a skill, a value, a character trait you aspire to gain and develop in order to achieve your academic and life goals.
